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Performance notes

Salaam is an anthem for peace written by Israeli musician, Mosh Ben Ari. The use of both Arabic and Hebrew words for peace, Salaam and Shalom, reflect the diverse languages and cultures found in Israel. Choirs should perform this piece with energy and optimism.

At the director's discretion, the ensemble may take the repeat to measure 43 more than once, increasing tempo and intensity each time.






Ross Fishman is a music educator, composer, and arranger from Plymouth, Minnesota. He received his Bachelor's degree in Music Education with a choral emphasis from the University of Kansas in Lawrence. Ross currently teaches middle school choir in Minnesota and has previously taught at international schools in Israel and China. With a strong background in Jewish music, Ross is committed to creating new Hebrew choral literature that can engage and inspire students, teachers, and audiences of all cultures.



Mosh Ben Ari

Mosh Ben Ari is an Israeli musician, lyricist and composer. He was born in Israel in 1970. He comes from a Yemenite and Iraqi background. He first discovered music as a child through the traditional Jewish and ethnic chants that were part of his everyday life. He started playing music at the age of 16 and since he has studied music around the world, including in India, Sahara and Sinai. He plays various string instruments such as acoustic and classic guitar, Indian sarod, Persian tar, Turkish jumbush, Moroccan ginberi and bass. In 1997 he founded, with a few friends, the

world music ensemble Sheva, which has released four albums and continues to tour the world doing dozens of shows in the most prestigious festivals and events. In 2001, Ben-Ari's debut solo album *Ad Elay* came out. In 2004, he released his second album, *Derekh (A Way)*, which established him as one of Israel's foremost singer-songwriters and performers. This album quickly went Gold in Israel. In 2006, Ben-Ari's third album, *Masa UMatan (Negotiations)*, was released. All of his albums were produced by Globalev World Music - Israel. Ben-Ari's music and performance is a celebration of groove and spirit, blending rock, soul, reggae and world music together with his rich unique voice.
