

About the composer

Daniel Brinsmead (b. 1988) is an award-winning composer and graduate of the School of Music at the Australian National University where he received a Bachelor of Music with Honours for performance studies in Classical Voice. In 2016 he completed a Master of Music majoring in Choral Conducting at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, Cardiff, UK.

His choral compositions and arrangements have been performed worldwide. He was selected as one of eight winners from 918 international entries to record his composition, Come Sleep, for the



Daniel resides and works in Melbourne, Australia, and is currently the Artistic Director of several choirs including The Australian Children's Choir and Choristry. He is also a singing and piano tutor, accompanist, composer, arranger, and orchestrator.



Composer Notes

The Passing of the Year' was composed for The Australian Children's Choir as the closing piece for our 2023 end-of-year Presentation Concert. I aimed to create a fun, rhythmic piece that is quick to learn and features an exciting piano accompaniment, designed to sound thrilling when performed by a massed choir. The text blends playfulness and heartfelt sentiment, emphasizing the importance of cherishing what truly matters.

Performance Notes

At first glance, the rhythmic complexity and compound meter may seem daunting, but the vocal lines are quite accessible. Once singers hear the melodies and speech-like rhythms, they should find the patterns intuitive and engaging. The repeated musical phrases and canons result in a piece that sounds harder than it is. Given the pianist's more demanding part, they may omit some notes if necessary. This piece is approachable for singers of all ages and abilities and can be performed in various formats, including unison or two-part arrangements (with or without the descant).

There are alternative text options (marked *) for the line "Summer is coming," allowing the piece to be adapted for various occasions, such as an end-of-school concert, graduation ceremony, or a Christmas performance where the imagery of bells is fitting. Options include:

- Summer has come in
- Winter has come in
- Noël is coming/Noël has come in
- The old year is ending (*requires a sixteenth-note upbeat, as marked in the score)
