The Poet: Edward Lear (1812–1888)

Edward Lear has long been regarded as one of the most curious figures in English literature. His great love for children led him early in his career to writing especially for them. Many have tried to infer some hidden meaning into his poems but they are completely void of any symbolism; they are nonsense pure and simple, and that is their charm. *Calico Pie*, *The Owl and the Pussycat*, *The Table and the Chair*, and the *Nonsense Alphabets* are among his better known works.

The Composer: Timothy Strang (b. 1947)

A graduate of the University of Illinois, Tim taught secondary vocal music until 1980 when he started his piano tuning and restoration business in Iowa City. His compositions range from hymns and anthems for general worship to secular vocal and instrumental music for children and adults.

Performance notes:

Calico Pie is a frolicking, energetic piece. Care should be taken to keep the tempo under control and unhurried. Diction will be especially important in conveying the whimsical text to the audience. A suggestion: whisper the text, and then sing the song maintaining the emphasis on consonants produced during the whispering.
