About St. Francis of Assisi: Founder the Franciscan Order, born at Assisi in Umbria, in 1181 or 1182; died there, October, 1226. The son of a prosperous Italian merchant, he turned to a life of religious thought at an early age, devoting himself to the care of the poor and the sick. His approach to religion was marked by its joyousness and its love of nature. He was canonized as a saint in 1228, two years after his death.

About the composer: David N. Childs, b. 1969 at Nelson in the South Island of New Zealand, has a Bachelor's degree in composition and musicology from Canterbury University, Christchurch, New Zealand, a Master of Music degree in Conducting from Florida State University, and a doctorate from Louisiana State University.
